Scallops, pure iron,


And the wall of the odd corpses.

Thursday 25th September 2025. An illustrated talk 'An Insight Into The Samaritans' by 'Steve and Jo'

Steve introduced himself as the speaker for the evening and Jo as backup for any 'tricky' questions, both of whom came from the Leicester Samaritan's branch, which opened in 1964. Steve described how initially he was vetted and underwent a rigorous training regime of 4 to 5 months before he qualified as a fully-fledged volunteer for the Samaritans. During part of the training that he undertook, Steve was taught how to show empathy, be patient, never be judgemental and most importantly, learn to listen.

The hours that Steve volunteers are worked as shifts because the organisation operates 24 hours a day, 365 days per year. The calls received cover a broad spectrum of people, including children, with some callers beyond the UK. The Samaritans are widely known as the 'suicide charity', but they do cover all forms of emotional support.

Confidentiality is a crucial part of their work, except if the caller wishes to contact another organisation that might help further with their problem. After their shift, the volunteers have a team debriefing to iron out any problems and offer help to any volunteer who has had concerns over a call, such as a suicide line, whereby the caller is dying as they talk to the volunteer, but hopefully, they take comfort in the fact that someone is with them to the end. Steve then showed us a short video made by a grateful caller – with her permission – because the Samaritans had totally changed her life.

Today there are 200 branches, with 23,000 volunteers and the Samaritans have now expanded their training to include suitable people to carry out similar duties as the Samaritans in prisons, schools, universities and the NHS.

The foundation of this organisation was the result of the Reverend Edward Chad Varah, an Anglican priest from Lincolnshire who vowed to help people in crisis after he had attended the funeral of a fourteen-year-old girl who died by suicide because she incorrectly self-diagnosed her menstrual cycle as a sexually transmitted disease. Subsequently, as rector of St Stephen's in London, Reverend Chad Varah founded the Samaritans, receiving his first call in 1953. His aim was to provide emotional support to anyone experiencing a crisis whilst keeping the organisation non-religious and non-political.

It was very brave of the committee to have booked this subject, which turned out to be engrossing and extremely informative. The room was hushed during the talk by an excellent speaker but erupted at question time when all queries were answered admirably by Jo and Steve.

'God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change. The courage to change the things I can. And the wisdom to know the difference.' Reinhold Niebuhr

This month, at the eleventh hour of the eleventh day we will pause to honour those who gave their lives serving our country. We will share this moment united with nations across the world that have been affected by the devastation of the two World Wars, and also more recent conflicts. War is always a tragedy. It brings great suffering and sorrow and often leaves scars that are not easily healed; losing loved ones, homes, or land is never easy to accept. While we cannot change the past, we are entrusted with the responsibility to shape the future. But it takes deep courage and wisdom to move forward: courage to let go of personal pain in pursuit of peace, and wisdom to discern how to act and how to accept. Achieving this isn't something we can do on our own we need God's guidance and help. You may recognise this prayer that has helped men and women all around the world, possibly because the answer to it lies in the prayer itself. 'God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change. The courage to change the things I can. And the wisdom to know the difference. Living one day at a time, enjoying one moment at a time. Accepting hardship as a pathway to peace. Taking, as Jesus did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it. Trusting that You will make all things right, if I surrender to Your will, so that I may be reasonably happy in this life, and supremely happy with You forever in the next. Amen.' This powerful little prayer offers us some comfort and direction in these moments of reflection. It encourages us to embrace serenity in the face of what cannot be altered, and to trust in God's greater plan. Life, even during times of peace, is strewn with knock backs and difficulties. It can often feel like climbing a mountain. But at the end of the day, it is not what we climb but how we climb, and whom we put our trust in on the way, that makes the difference to how we emerge. Reinhold Niebuhr understood this when he penned his 'Serenity Prayer', offering a source of hope and resilience as we journey on in God's plan and purpose for our lives.

Update from the Parish Council Meeting - 13th October 2025

X Allotments

Long Clawson: An email was sent to the adjacent developer regarding the clearance of two plots. As no response has been received, these plots will remain decommissioned.

Hose: The Parish Council continues to dispute the refund from Waterplus. £216.16 in credits for Used and Surface Water Charges remain outstanding, along with the removal of inappropriate late payment charges. A detailed reconciliation and corrected refund have been requested. The Council has also challenged the rateable value charges and requested a water meter installation for more accurate billing.

Speed Monitoring (MVAS)

Members reviewed data from the MVAS unit on Harby Lane, Hose. The full dataset will be shared with the police, the Community Speed Watch team, and our volunteers. It will also support upcoming grant applications. Total vehicle movements (2 months): 64,832, Average speeding vehicle speed: 39.5 MPH, Highest recorded speed: 70 MPH at 18:20 on 4th September 2025.

Boundary Resolution

The boundary issue between Harby allotments and Harefield Close has been resolved. Land Registry confirmed the area is developer-retained, making the hedge a shared responsibility.

Village Greens

All registered village greens in the parish are under review. These must remain open to the public. It is a criminal offence to Damage a green, Place animals or materials on it, Obstruct its recreational use. Under Section 29 of the Commons Act 1876, any encroachment or structure is considered a public nuisance unless it enhances the green's enjoyment. Prosecutions may be brought under Section 12 of the Inclosure Act by the parish or landowner, or under Section 29 by any parish inhabitant.

Cemetery Waste Collection

Bin emptying at Long Clawson Cemetery stopped without notice, causing a backlog. A new waste contractor has now been appointed, and normal service is expected to resume shortly.

Culvert Cleansing

The final stage of culvert cleansing in Long Clawson took place during the week commencing 13th October. It is hoped this will resolve local flooding issues.
